

#### **Ditchling Beacon** - catch the Breeze 79

At 248 metres above sea level, Ditchling Beacon is the highest point in East Sussex and offers panoramic views of the coast, downs and the Weald. The 30-minute bus ride is extremely scenic, with wideranging downland views from your top deck seat. Now managed by the National Trust and Sussex Wildlife Trust it offers many possible walks east or west along the South Downs Way National Trail.

#### **Discovery tickets**

Discovery tickets are issued and accepted by most local operators in West Sussex, East Sussex, Surrey, Brighton & Hove and East Hampshire.

Child Discovery fare is £8 (aged 5-15). Family Discovery (up to five people with a minimum of one adult and a maximum of two adults) is £20.

Other exclusions may apply. Check with the operator. Prices may change.
